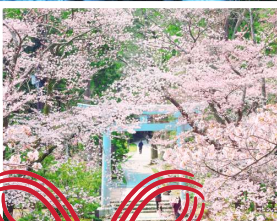
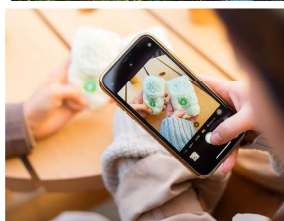

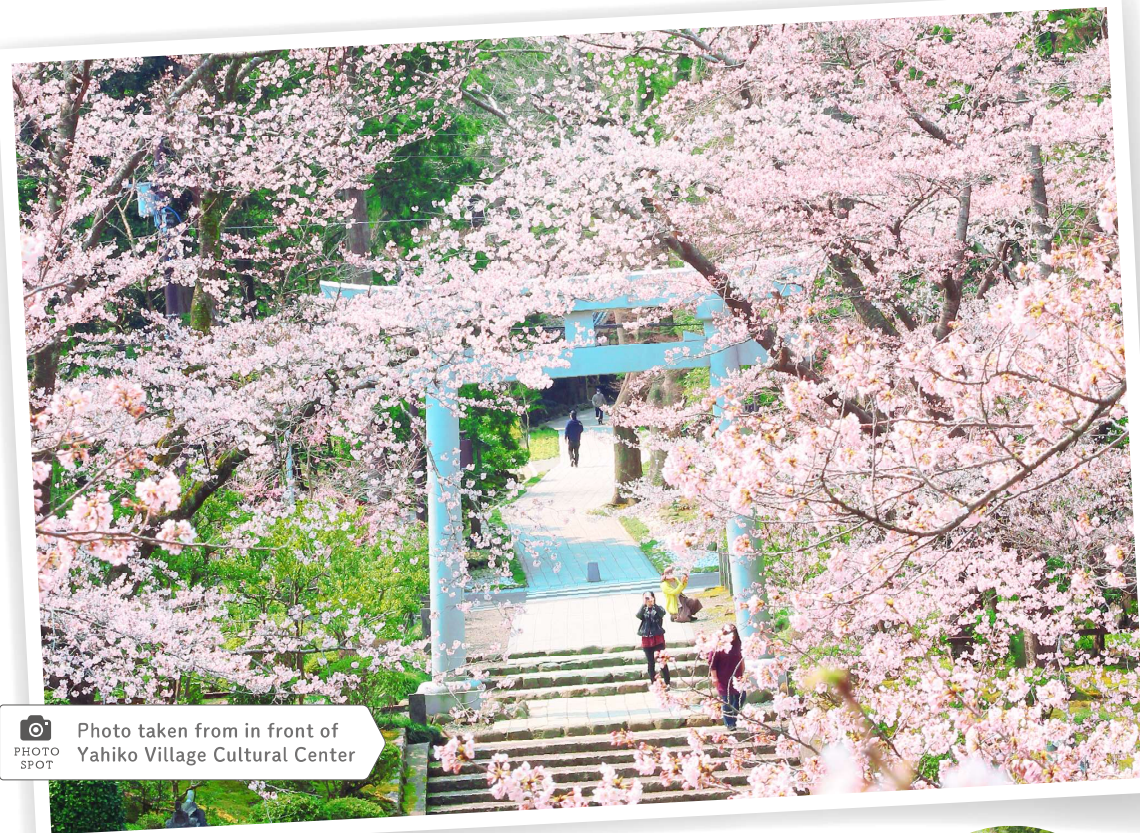

Enjoy a variety of cherry blossoms starting with somei-yoshino in early April to double-flower yaezakura coming into full bloom before the Golden Week holiday. Mt. Yahiko and their surrounding areas are covered with beautiful warm- and cold-region flowers. The chirping of wild birds sounds pleasant to your ears and will move your soul. Mt. Yahiko is open for climbing starting in early April.

A Must-See Spring Event!

Yukake (Hot Water Splashing) Festival

This popular festival is a dedication of sacred hot spring water drawn from Yu Shrine (meaning "hot water shrine" in Japanese), the origin of Yahiko Onsen hot spring. The sacred hot water is placed in a cart and paraded through the hot spring district while hot water is splashed onto onlookers with stalks of green bamboo. The festival also features chanting and barrel drum performances by a parish youth group as well as a hand dance by geishas.

Enjoy nature around Mt. Yahiko under the fresh, clear summer sky, visit historical Yahiko Shrine and take a leisurely stroll through the hot spring district during the day. Azaleas bloom in Yahiko Park, and the new green leaves are illuminated at night. See fireflies by the waterside. Stroll through the town wearing a yukata and you may discover something new and attractive in Yahiko.

Yahiko Lantern Festival

Designated an important intangible folk-cultural property, the Yahiko Lantern Festival has been observed for 1,000 years at Yahiko Shrine. Traditional folk song dances are held on July 24th. During the daytime on the 25th, local children carry lanterns, and at night, huge lanterns and portable shrines parade through the hot spring district. The evening reaches its climax with fireworks. On the 26th, Kangyo-sai, A ceremony of carrying spirits in portable shrines to be returned to Yahiko Shrine, is held, marking the end of the festival.

Mesmerized by vivid autumn colors

The autumn foliage in Yahiko Park and Yahiko Chrysanthemum Festival attract the largest number of tourists from in- and outside of the prefecture.

From late October to mid-November, the Momiji-dani (meaning "valley of autumn foliage" in Japanese) in Yahiko Park is illuminated, enveloping the area with a mystical atmosphere. Its beauty has resulted in the Momiji-dani illuminated being registered as a Night View Heritage event of Japan in 2023.

Held on the grounds of Yahiko Shrine, the Yahiko Chrysanthemum Festival serves as a dedication to the shrine and as a competitive chrysanthemum exhibition. Masterpieces diligently grown over a year by chrysanthemum enthusiasts from in- and outside of the prefecture are on display. The large landscaped flower bed is created under a different theme every year, whose dynamic sight draws the gaze of chrysanthemum viewers.

About the time Mt. Yahiko is lightly covered with white snow, swans, which have been synonymous with beauty and purity since ancient times, arrive. The sight of flying swans and magnificent Mt. Yahiko mesmerizes visitors. Many people visit Yahiko Shrine during the New Year's holidays to pray for a safe year. Another enjoyment is tasting oden and amazake (sweet half sake) provided at souvenir stores lined up in front of the Shrine.

Ninen Mode (visit of the New Year's Eve and New Year's Day)/ Hatsu Mode (first shrine visit of the year)

Over 1 million people come to pray at Yahiko Shrine every year, and the number of prayers over the New Year holidays are ranked No. 1 in Niigata, a prefecture that is home to the largest number of shrines in Japan. Especially, a record number of worshippers visit from December 31st to the evening of January first. End the old year and start the new year with a pure heart by visiting the Yahiko Shrine, which shows another side of its appeal each time you visit.

Yahiko Shrine

彌彦神社

Yahiko Shrine, aka Oyahikosama, is Echigo Ichinomiya (the most important provincial shrine in the Echigo area) and is visited by many worshippers. Feel the mysterious power as you step into this area surrounded by cedar and zelkova trees aged over 400 years. Known as the home of the god of matchmaking, it attracts women praying for a good partner. There are smaller shrines, called sessha and massha (shrines for sub gods), located in- and around the premises. Sessha in the photo on the left enshrines six generations of the descendants of Yahiko Okami. Visiting sessha and massha is recommended when visiting Yahiko.

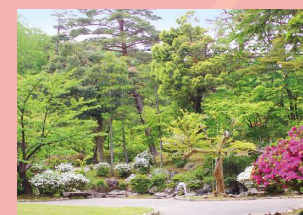

The park is located only one minute on foot from Yahiko Station. In the area of approximately 40,000 tsubo (approximately 13 hectares), visitors are treated to a beautiful natural landscape, with cherry blossoms in spring, green leaves in early summer, and autumn foliage in fall.

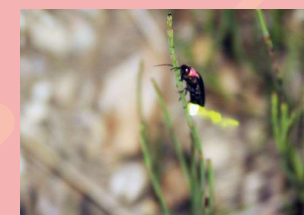
Momiji-dani, in particular, is known for its beautiful autumn foliage, mesmerizing visitors with the contrast of the vermilion Kangetsu-kyo Bridge and the autumn foliage. The illuminated foliage at night makes it a mystical atmosphere. With the Chrysanthemum Festival held about this time, autumn is the season that attracts the largest number of tourists.

Mt. Yahiko ropeway, about a 5-minute ride from Sanroku Station to Sancho Station, offers magnificent views of the Echigo Plain with the mountains of Echigo in background. Enjoy your time at Yahiko Summit Park with stops at a restaurant that serves Nihonkai Yuhi Ramen (meaning "ramen resembling the sunset in the Japan Sea") and a Tree Parfait, take in a stunning 360° view at Panorama Tower, a 100m/328ft rotating observation point over looking the sea of Japan the Echigo plains and the isle of Sado.

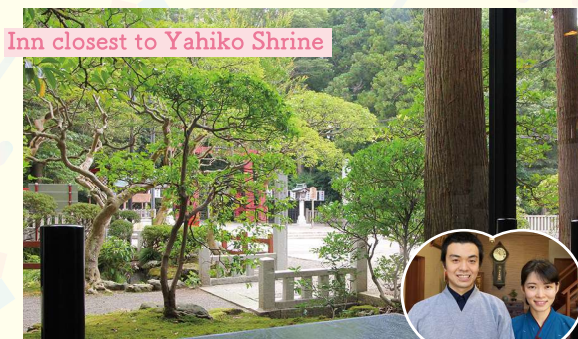
